



Marching for Peace

Members of the The Interfaith Peace Walk, led by Buddhist monks Kanaeda Shonin and Perez Shonin, visited Hood River, Ore. last week. The march is a 300-mile pilgrimage from the Hanford Nuclear site at Richland, Wash., to the Trident nuclear submarine base at Bangor, Wash., The marchers continued west, passing through Astoria Friday, July 22, where they hosted an event focusing on peace, nonviolent conflict resolution, and earth stewardship. The Hanford to Bangor Peace Walk began July 16 and will end August 7, on the 60th anniversary of the destruction of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, Japan, by atomic bombs at the end of World War II.

Chinookan encounters with Lewis and Clark to be presented at Discovery Center

The Columbia Gorge Discovery Center is sponsoring an Oregon Chautauqua program by Pat Courtney Gold on Saturday, August 13. Entitled *The Chinookan Nations Encounter the Corps of Discovery*, the program is free to members or included with paid admission.

Pat Courtney Gold will offer an indigenous view of the rich history and culture of the Chinookan Nation, from its international trade to the extensive role of women in that trade. Excerpts from the Corps' journals will be reexamined in the light of this more complete picture, and slide images will highlight the encounters between the Chinookan people and the members of

the Expedition.

The powerful Chinookan Nations lived along the Columbia River for thousands of years. In

1805 and 1806, the Corps of Discovery encountered the sizeable towns of the Chinookan people. Members of the Corps had problems with the Chinookan language and culture, and became alienated and paranoid through misunderstandings.

As a result, they made poor choices and experienced unnecessary hardships due to inadequate housing, unsuitable clothing, spoiled food, and poor diets. Their Christian faith and prejudiced impressions tainted their portrayal of the Chinookan people in their now-famous journals.

Gold's program is made possible by funding from the Oregon Council for the Humanities, an independent, nonprofit

affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities. The presentation will begin at 2 p.m.

The Columbia Gorge Discovery Center and Museum is located in The Dalles. The museum interprets the cultural and natural history of the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area and Wasco County. Attractions include: Kids Explorer Room, museum store, café, paved trails and picnic areas overlooking the Columbia River. Parking and access to hiking trails and picnic area are free.
